Analysis of Transferred Votes in the Northern Ireland Assembly Election 2011

Key Points

In the Northern Ireland Assembly election 2011 the majority of Unionist transfers were from Unionist parties while the majority of Nationalist transfers were from Nationalist parties. This was also the case in the previous Northern Ireland Assembly election in 2007.

The total number of transferred votes was lower compared with 2007, due to the smaller number of candidates in this election.

Of the five main parties:

- The UUP¹ received the highest number of transfer votes **from** other parties;
- Alliance² received the lowest number of transfer votes **from** other parties;
- The highest number of transfers **to** other parties were from UUP candidates; and,
- The lowest number of transfers **to** other parties were from SDLP candidates

Thirty four of the 108 successful candidates were elected to the Northern Ireland Assembly on first preference votes only. The remaining 74 successful candidates were elected on the basis of first preference votes and vote transfers.

1 Overview

A lower number of votes were transferred in the 2011 Northern Ireland Assembly election than in the previous election in 2007 (81,495³ compared with 104,182 excluding within-party transfers), reflecting in part the lower turnout in the most recent election but primarily due to the smaller number of candidates. An analysis of transferred votes revealed that the majority (87%) of Unionist votes were transferred from Unionist parties while the majority (89%) of Nationalist votes were transferred from Nationalist parties. When within-party transfers⁴ are excluded:

- Three quarters (74%) of transfers from Unionist voters⁵ went to other Unionist party candidates, a decrease from 79% in 2007. As with 2007, 12% went to Nationalist party candidates.
- Just under two thirds (64%) of transfers from Nationalist voters⁶ went to other Nationalist party candidates. While there was no change in the proportion of transfers to other Nationalist parties, the proportion transferred to Unionist parties decreased from 13% to 6%. The proportion of transfers from Nationalist voters to other parties increased accordingly.
- When compared with 2007, the proportion of transfers to Alliance increased slightly.

2 Transferred votes by Party

Of the five main parties:


- The UUP received the most transferred votes from other parties while Alliance received the lowest number of transfers from other parties. In the 2007 election the SDLP received the most transferred votes from other parties while Sinn Féin received the fewest.
- Most transfers to other parties were from UUP candidates while the lowest number of transfers to other parties were from SDLP candidates.

DUP candidates received a total of 33,251 transferred votes, 16,835 of which were transferred from their own party and 16,416 were transferred from voters of other parties. Excluding own party transfers, most transfer votes (62%) came from other Unionist voters while 36% were from other voters. Only 2% came from Nationalist voters. Compared with 2007 transfers, a lower proportion of transfers (excluding own party transfers) came from other Unionist votes (65% in 2007) and a higher proportion came from other voters (33% in 2007). The proportion from Nationalist voters remained unchanged at 2%.

Sinn Féin candidates received a total of 26,887⁷ transferred votes, 19,738 of which were transferred from their own party and 7,149 were transferred from voters of other parties. Excluding own party transfers, most transfers (75%) came from other voters (i.e. those voting for parties that are neither Nationalist nor Unionist). Almost a quarter (22.4%) of transfers came from SDLP voters while only 2.2% from Unionist voters. Proportionally, transfers to Sinn Féin remain broadly unchanged from the 2007 election.

Ulster Unionist Party candidates received a total of 31,333⁸ transferred votes, 10,223 of which were transferred from their own party and 21,110 were transferred from voters of other parties. Excluding own party transfers, most transfers (63%) came from votes that were neither Nationalist nor Unionist while 36% came from voters of other Unionist parties and 2% from Nationalist voters. Compared with 2007 transfers, a lower proportion of transfers came from other Unionist votes (42% in 2007). The proportion from Nationalist voters also decreased from 7% in 2007 while a higher proportion of transfers came from other voters (51% in 2007).

SDLP candidates received a total of 26,292 transferred votes, 6,883 of which were transferred from their own party and 19,409 were transferred from voters of other parties. Excluding own party transfers, the highest proportion of vote transfers (55%) came from other voters, 29% came from Sinn Féin voters and 16% from Unionist voters. Compared with 2007 transfers, a lower proportion of transfers (excluding own party transfers) came from Sinn Féin voters (39% in 2007) and Unionist voters (13% in 2007) while a higher proportion came from other voters (48% in 2007).


Alliance candidates received a total of 8,027 transferred votes, 1,243 of which were transferred from their own party and 6,784 were transferred from voters of other parties. Excluding own party transfers, half of vote transfers (50%) came from other voters, 26% came from Nationalist voters and 24% from Unionist voters. Compared with 2007 transfers, a lower proportion of transfers (excluding own party transfers) came from Nationalist votes (32% in 2007) and from other voters (55% in 2007) while a lower proportion came from Unionist voters (13% in 2007).


The **TUV** candidates received a total of 2,979 transferred votes, 563 of which were transferred from their own party and 2,416 were transferred from voters of other parties. Excluding own party transfers, most transfers (73%) came from Unionist voters while 26% came from other voters. Less than one per cent were transferred from Nationalist Voters. The **TUV** did not exist for the 2007 Assembly elections, having been formed in December of that year. In the 2011 elections there was one seat won by the TUV.


The **Progressive Unionist Party** candidates received a total of 469 transferred votes, all of which were transferred from voters of parties other than the PUP. Most of these transfers (73%) came from Unionist voters, with 25% coming from other voters and 2% from Nationalist voters. The PUP lost its only seat in the 2011 election.




The **Green Party** candidates received a total of 2,075 transferred votes, more than two thirds (69%) of which came from candidates that were neither Unionist nor Nationalist. The Green Party received the least transferred votes from Unionist voters (9%). Transfers from Nationalist voters made up a fifth (21%) of votes transferred to the Green Party. The Green Party won one seat in the 2011 election. Compared with 2007 transfers, a lower proportion of transfers (excluding own party transfers) came from Unionist voters (17% in 2007) and a higher proportion came from other voters (63% in 2007) while the proportion from Nationalist voters remained relatively unchanged (20% in 2007).












3 Transferred votes by Constituency


Thirty four of the 108 successful candidates were elected to the Northern Ireland Assembly on first preference votes only while the remaining 74 were elected on the basis of first preference votes and vote transfers.



This table is then followed by a series of charts which present the election results for each Constituency showing first preference and transferred votes for each candidate (candidates above the horizontal line in each chart were elected).


